
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Please could parents and carers of KS1 children tensure that they are brought into, and collected from, inside the school grounds (KS1 playground) at the start and end of the school day.


### Out of School Tax Free Child Care

If you or your partner both work and earn between minimum wage and £100,000 per year, you are probably eligible to save 25% on Childcare costs with HMRC Tax Free Childcare.

It is very easy to apply and school have already registered. Each month you add funds to your HMRC account and for every £8 you pay, they give you a £2 top up. Payments are then made direct to school by HMRC.

It is quick and easy to upload the voucher to school Spider, and then book in to sessions in same way as we have always done but instead of paying by card, you use your voucher credit. You can cancel sessions for a refund back to your voucher or make changes up to 24 hours prior to the session just like paying by card. WOW is a pupil-led initiative where children self-report how they get to school every day using an interactive WOW Travel Tracker. If they travel sustainably (walk/wheel, cycle or scoot) once a week for a month, they get rewarded with a badge (see below). It's that easy! With the aim of living a healthier lifestyle, both physically and emotionally as well as considering the benefits to our environment is something that we are encouraging but understand that some families live too far for this to be sensibly possible. So for these families, we suggest a Park and Stride system where the St Andrew's Church could be used, The Red Lion Pub have kindly agreed that their car park could be used or even some of the residential streets that are close to school—with the usual consideration paid to the residents who live there.
